#### **Classroom expectations**

Remember that you are here to learn. Therefore, the following behavior will be expected of you every day:

1) Be on time and prepared.

You must be in your seat when the bell rings, and have all your recommended materials with you every day.

- 2) Respect yourself, others, and their property.
- 3) Finish any conversation, eating, drinking or grooming before entering the classroom.

Gum, eating, drinking, grooming, and conversations not assigned by the teacher are not allowed during class. We need to keep our classroom clean and ourselves focused on the subject.

4) Remain seated, and put all non-instructional and distracting items away

These and other consequences may be applied at the teacher's discretion. (This list is not in any particular order.)

Rewards, on the other hand, may include praise, positive notes, homework passes, and other rewards as teacher sees fit.

### Tardy policy

Arriving to class after the bell is considered an "unexcused tardy" unless you have a pass. Excessive tardies may result in school disciplinary action, so make sure to arrive on time.

### Homework policy

Homework will be assigned **every day**, including Friday. If applicable, the homework will be stamped for completion the day it is due, and graded during class (there will be times when the homework will be to study, so there will be no physical homework to stamp). Late homework will be accepted only under special circumstances.

### Unit packet

Homework, classwork, notes and warm-ups will be submitted at the end of the unit in a unit packet. There will be a checklist posted on the website for you to print (or copy by hand if you are unable to print) and use to put your packet together. You will have to include your scores and add them up, staple the checklist on top of the packet, and have your packet ready to submit at the door the day it is due. You will have to put your packet in the order given in the checklist, and have somebody double check your scores, and sign that your scores are indeed correct. If a student is caught giving him/herself more credit than he/she obtained, he/she will be subject to academic and/or disciplinary action.

#### Binder

The purpose of the binder and dividers is to help you be organized, and to save you time when putting your unit packet together; therefore, you should have the following sections in your binder: 1) Warm-ups 2) Notes 3) Classwork 4) Homework 5) Other.

#### Make-up work

If you are absent, you may find your missing assignments on my website (listed above). You may obtain anything not listed on the website from a classmate. Due to the nature of some activities, make-ups are not always possible.

## Tests and quizzes

There will absolutely not be any make-up quizzes. If you miss a quiz, the same percentage that you obtain on the unit test or the next quiz will be applied to the quiz that you missed.
